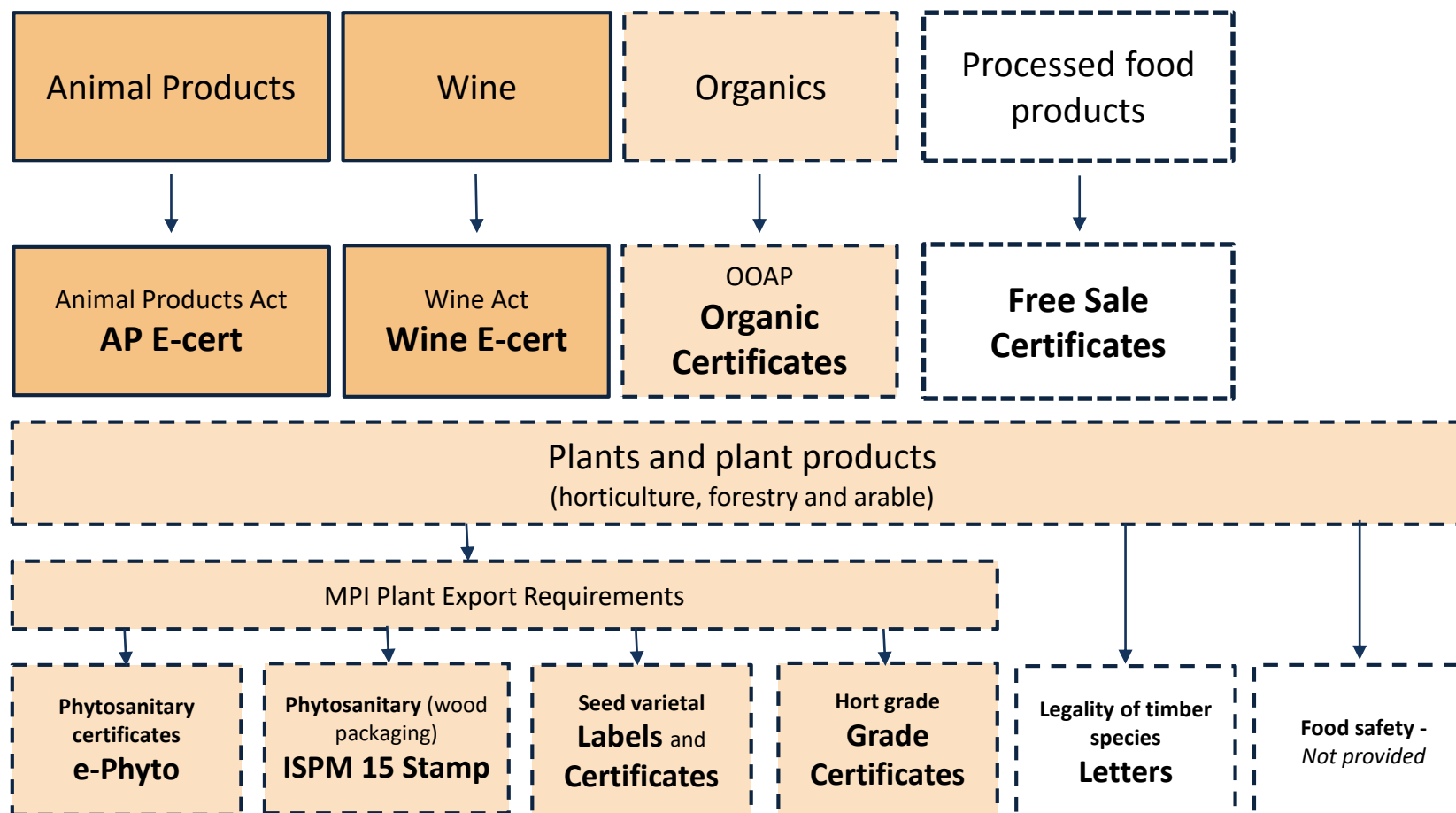

Current Export Assurances



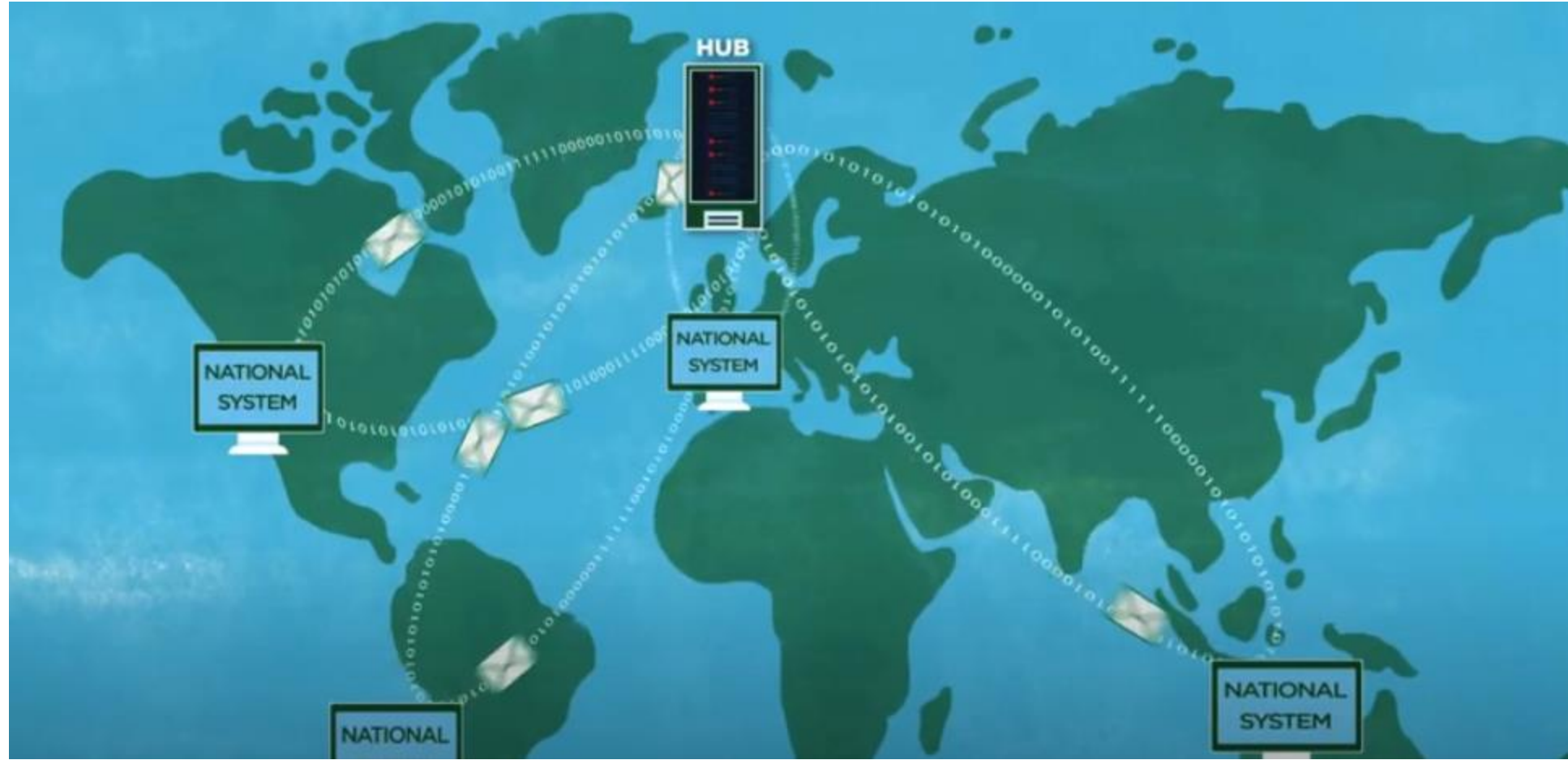
Paperless Progress – AP Ecert

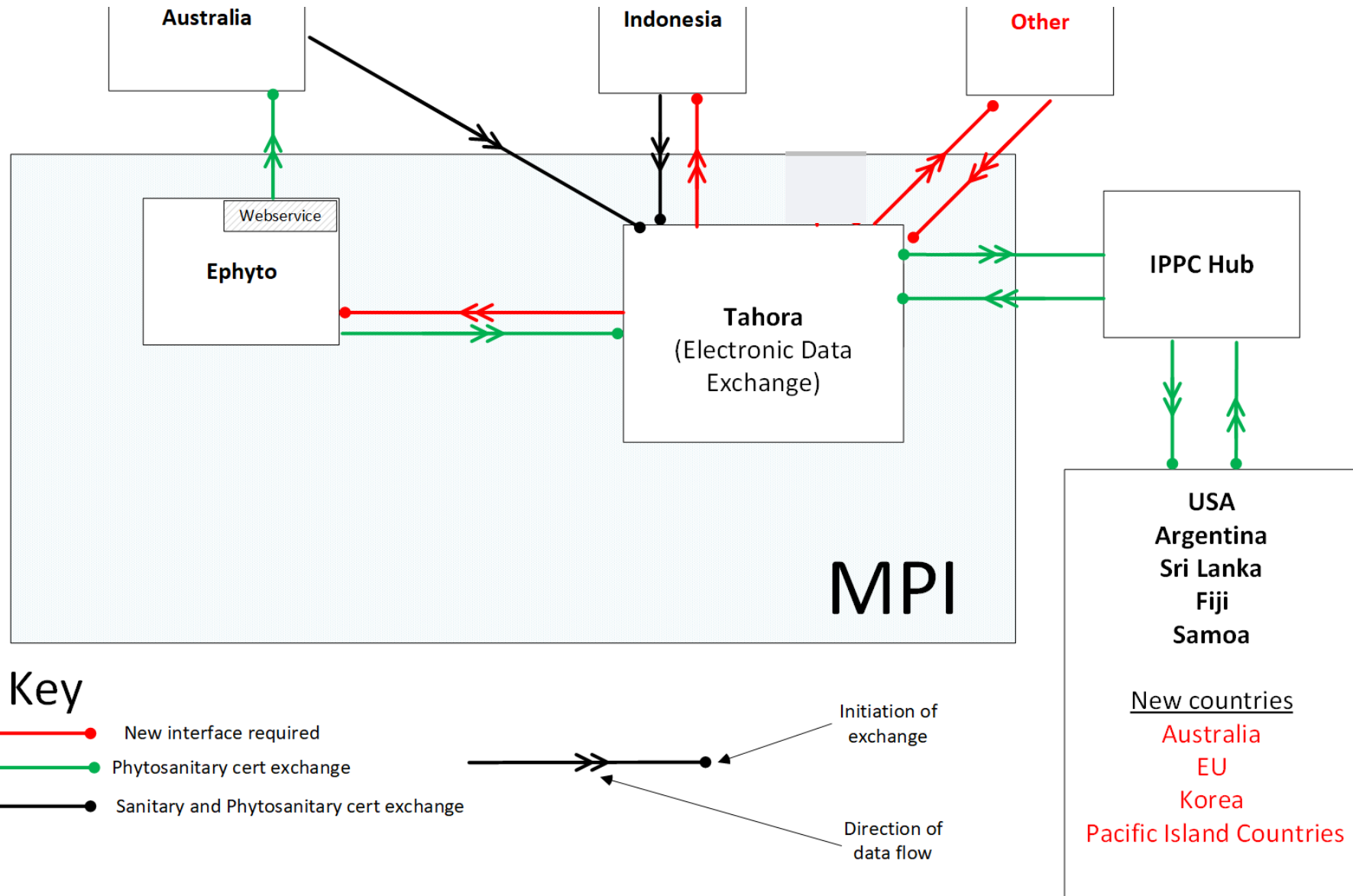
- Australia – paperless and two-way for most commodities
- Canada – paperless for meat and meat products (human consumption)
- China – data exchange but not yet paperless
- EU – soon to be paperless for all commodities
- Indonesia – data exchange but not yet paperless
- Korea – data exchange but not yet paperless
- Russia – data exchange only
- Philippines – data exchange (very recent); paperless for meat products
- UAE – data exchange trial started; should result in full paperless
- Taiwan, Viet Nam, UK, India – in discussion

Paperless/Electronic Data Exchange Progress – ePhyto

Plants and plant products – Phytosanitary Certification

- Australia – paperless and two way
- Argentina, Fiji, Indonesia, Samoa, Sri Lanka, US – data exchange with paper running in parallel
- Work is progressing with many other countries including EU and several Asian markets





Paperless/Electronic Data Exchange Progress – Organic

- Organic certificates are additional to other export certificates
- EU – web-based electronic certification via TRACES with paper copy
- Other markets paper-based

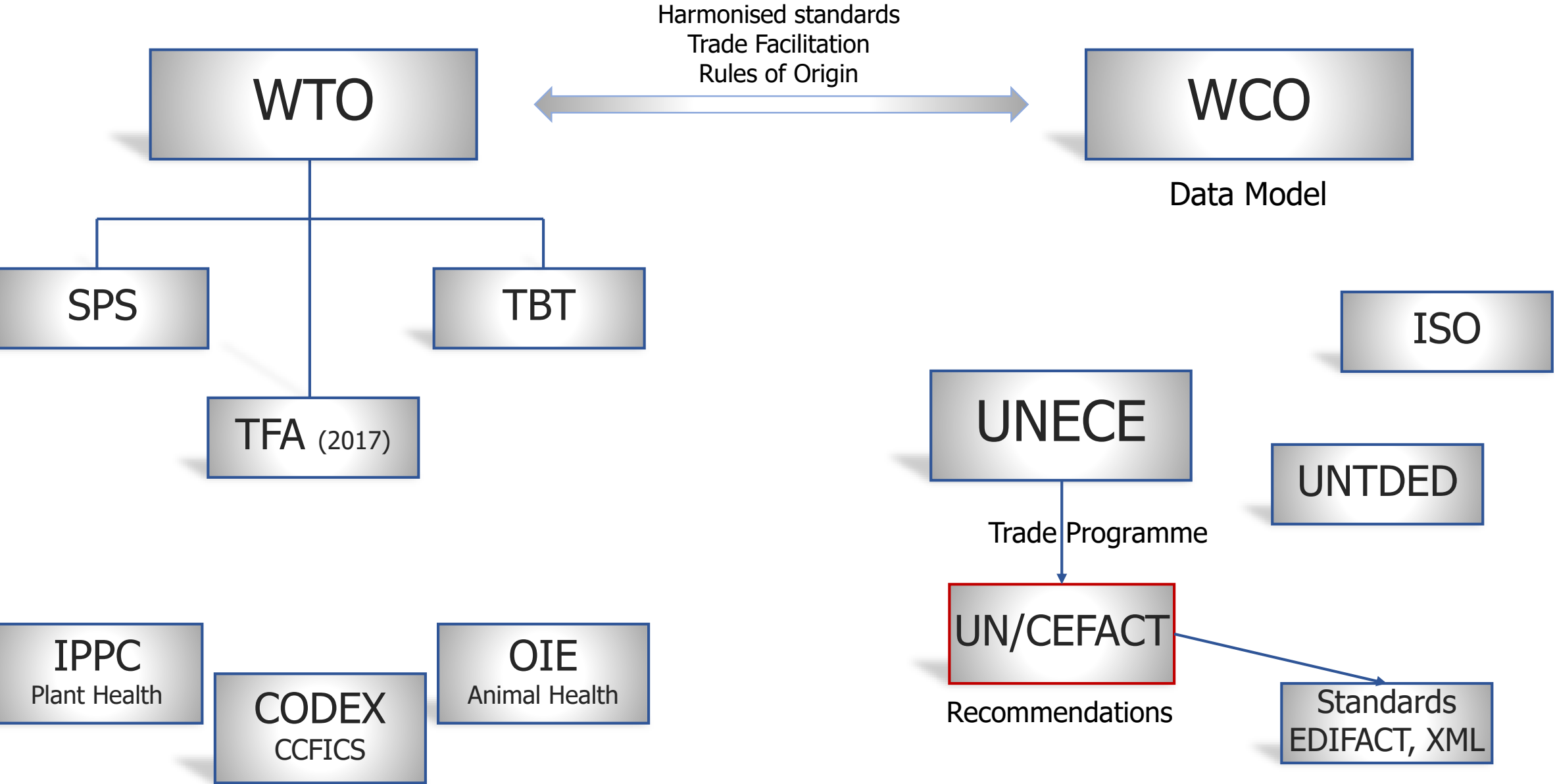
Drivers

- Digitalisation across global supply chains; new technologies
- Increasing supply chain complexity
- Rise of cross border e-commerce
- Expectation of reciprocity – two way electronic certificate exchange
- Demand for product and supply chain information with traceability back to source (authenticity)
- Demand for new assurances
- Need to combat fraud

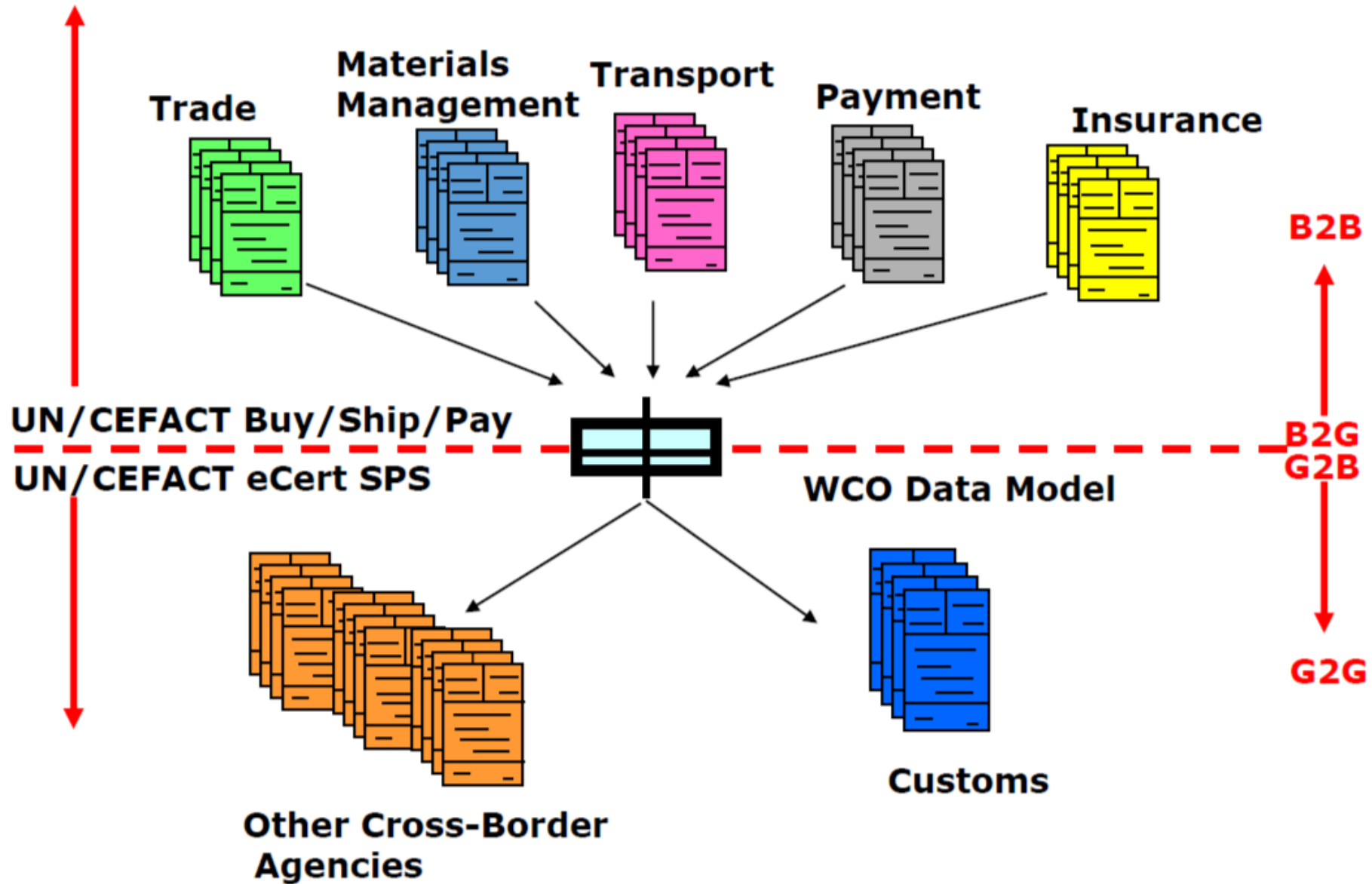
Benefits
